

## EASIER THAN IT LOOKS BABY BLANKET

Materials: Border Color: 1 skein Big Bad Wool Weepaca (Coral pictured)

Main Color 1: 4 skeins Big Wool Weepaca (Bleach White pictured) Main Color 2: 4 skeins Big Wool Weepaca (Great Lakes pictured)

Needles: Size 8 circular needles, 32"

Gauge: 18 sts/4" in garter (or close to it)

Finished Measurements: 29" x 33"

Pattern Stitch: (Knit 7, purl 7) repeat to the last 7 sts., knit 7.

Begin: Cast on 133 stitches in **border color** and knit 4 rows. Cut yarn.

Change to **main color 1** and work in pattern stitch for 2 rows. Change to **main color 2** and work in pattern stitch for 2 rows.

Continue working alternating 2 rows of main color 1 with 2 rows of main color 2, ending at desired length or approximately 32" and after completing 2 rows of main color 1 in pattern. Cut both main colors.

End: With **border color**, knit 3 rows and bind off.

**Tip**: When changing colors along the side, always pull the new yarn to the front of the old yarn, so the edge has a neater look.

**For a smaller blanket**, 24" x 28", cast on 105 sts. This smaller blanket would use 7 skeins of Weepaca: 1 for the border and 3 each of the main colors

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
